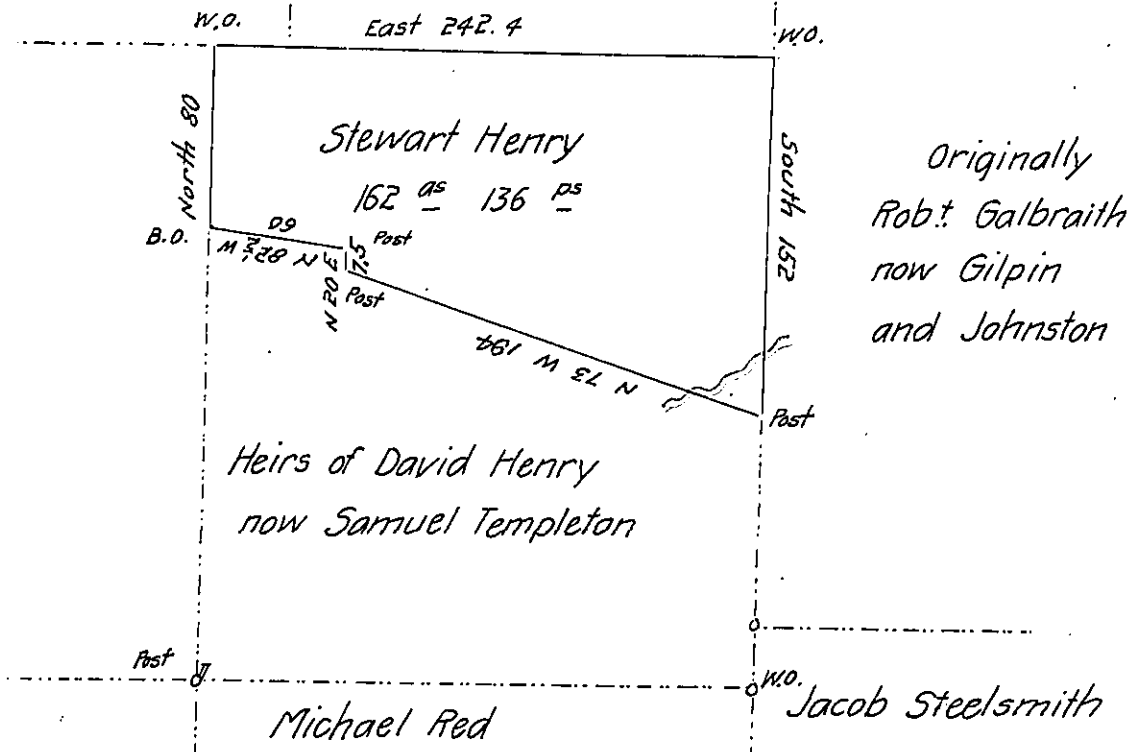

In pursuance of a Warrant dated 16<sup>th</sup> March 1807 Granted to David Henry was Surveyed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1807 (as appears from the Warrant and Draught of Survey filed in the office and the marks on the ground) Containing in all three hundred eighty-five acres fifty-five perches and allowance of Six per Cent &c. Situate in (now) sugar creek Township Armstrong County N.W. of the Allegheny River

And now to Wit " on the 29<sup>th</sup> of March 1838 resurveyed to Stewart Henry that part of the above Survey including the Letter A containing containing one hundred sixty two acres one hundred thirty six perches and allowance of Six per Cent &c. Situate in Sugar creek Township Armstrong County N.W. of the Allegheny River.
