



Situate late in Reading but now in Washington Township in the County of York Containing as above set forth 175<sup>as</sup> & 147 perches & Allowance &c being part of a larger tract of 195<sup>as</sup> & 18 perches & Allowance of Land &c. Originally surveyed by Charles Lukens late D.S. on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of Dec<sup>r</sup> 1765 in pursuance of a Warrant for 100<sup>as</sup> granted to Martin Klawdy bearing date the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1742 Resurveyed & divided off from the said larger tract of land on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of August 1804 for and at the request of the present owner Jacob Hollinger And now on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1813 the same has been calculated examined &c<sup>d</sup> and found to be correct, and returned for confirmation.
