The above Noted Land was Surveyed unto James Love on a branch of Brandwine Creek in Caln Township in Chester County Including the said Loves Improvement and the same Land ^{that was} marked out to Peter Babb Beginning at a Corner post in Joseph Darlington's Line Thence west on the Line formerly marked for the said Babb 169 perches to a post Thence North 52 perches to a Black Oak near the said - Babbs fence Thence North North East 23 perches to a Hickery Thence North 50 perches to a Black Oak one perch to y^e West of George Claypools Corner Thence East 160 perches to a Black Oak at the Corner of Joseph Darlington Thence South on the said Darlington's Line 123 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Nineteen acres & a Quarter - Beside the Allowance of Six p Cent
