



IN PURSUANCE of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 1738; Surveyed unto Francis Swaine on the 20<sup>th</sup> of July then next ensuing the above described Tract of Land situate in West Caln Township in the County of Chester Containing two Hundred acres and the Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent

Un<sup>o</sup> Taylor

Cave that no Return be made of this Land to Francis Swaine till James McMath be heard who has a right to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  within this Tract as shewed by the pricked lines.

June 20<sup>th</sup> 1740. The sd. 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  as were Returned into the Secy's office the 20<sup>th</sup> May 1745 by Warr<sup>t</sup> of the same Date for the use of James Way.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Twenty fifth day of July 1905.
