



Situate in Shrewsbury Township, York County, Containing as above set forth two hundred and forty four acres, One hundred and fifty four perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Originally surveyed by Thomas Armor on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of November 1751, in pursuance of a Warrant for 100<sup>ac</sup> granted to Jacob Keller dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Augt A. D. 1753. As appears by a copy of the field notes of said Survey, certified by John Forsythe, Esq<sup>s</sup>, late D. S. which Survey is presumed to have been made under the direction of the then Deputy Surveyor of said County.

And now at the request of Peter Goodling, the present owner of said land, the same is examined, corrected and returned for confirmation, December 1<sup>st</sup> 1821
