



Surveyed to John Black a Tract of Land in Donegal Township according to the above figure Beginning at a post being a Corner of James Andersons tract thence South Seventy three Degrees West 78 pches to a Black Oak thence West 223 ps. to a hickery then South 98 ps. to a post then East 310 1/2 ps. to a Spanish Oak then North 2 Degs East 91 ps to a Black oak then West 12 ps. to a White oak then North 8 Degs West thirty perches to the Beginning. containing one Hundred & Eighty five acres & the usual allowance for Roads &c. Surveyed ye 24th of August Anno 1739
