



Adam Scheffer

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Nineteenth day of February 1734 surveyed unto Jacob Harman a Tract of Land situate on the south side of Three Mile Run in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a White Elm on the Bank of sd Creek being a corner of Isaac Waltons Land thence by the same South East two hundred perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land South West one hundred perches to a post thence by land laid out to Michael Frylick North West one hundred and twenty seven perches to a White Oak, thence by said Frylick's Land South West sixty-nine perches to a post, thence by land laid out to Adam Scheffer North West fifty nine perches to the afore sd Three Mile Run, thence by ye sd Run North forty eight degrees East Eight perches then leaving the Run North Thirty-Eight degrees East Fifteen perches to a White Oak markt for a corner, thence North forty-two perches to an Elm tree standing on the bank of sd Run, thence down the same to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p Cent
