



By Virtue of ^{TWO} Warrants from the Proprietaries the one for Laying of of one hundred & fifty acres of Land Dated the ^{twenty} seventh day of June 1734 and ye other for the laying out of fifty acres dated the twentieth day of September 1734. There was surveyed unto George Shoemaker in one Tract 200 acres of Land situate in Newcomisschoppen part in the County of Philada and part in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a post a Corner of the German Tract Thence by Vacant Land North fifty eight degrees East one hundred thirty nine perches to a post thence by Land of Ulrick Rasor East one hundred thirty three perches to a Maple tree thence by Land of George Welver South Ninety perches and by Vacant Land sixteen perches to a post thence by Vacant Land south West one hundred ^{six} fifty ₂ perches to a post in a line of sd German Tract thence by the same North West two hundred and one perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred acres with the usual Allowance of six p. Cent. surveyed Decem^r 9 1734
