



A Draft of a Piece of land situate in Southampton Township in the County of Franklin. Containing forty five Acres three quarters and an allowance proportional to Six P Cent for Roads &c. for which there are three different Claimants, Viz George Johnston in pursuance of his Warrant bearing date the 4th day of May 1791, William Smith, in pursuance of his Warrant bearing date the 24th day of November 1791, and Thomas Greer who alleges the Survey of his land adjoining, made many years ago, did not include all the land intended by his Warrant or Order, but who it is said has since obtained a Patent for the land then surveyd to him on said Warrant or Order. Some part of this Land, as I am informed has been improved on by said Smith & his Father James Smith deceased for about five Years. Surveyd December 2^d 1791. This dispute being submitted to the Board of Property the 3^d Jan^y 1792 gave Judgement in favor of George Johnston
