



By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 2^d September 1784.

Surveyed the 2^d November 1784 to Abraham Lukens the above described tract of Land Situate on a Small branch of Shoholy Creek about one mile North of the main Creek & about 3 miles from the Mouth of Shoholy-on a path leading from Handsom Eddy to Shoholy House in Northampton County containing Forty three acres sixty perches & the allowance of six P Cent $\frac{60}{100}$
