In pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Februar (obl.) 1785, entitled, "An Act for directing the mode of distribu (obl.) the Donation Lands," promised the troops by this Commonwealth; and by order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1786, the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and allowance for roads, &c. N<sup>o</sup> 1816, situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 2, on the west side of the Allegheny River, in the county of Westmoreland.
