



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries, dated the eighth day of May 1733. Surveyed unto Adam Harter a tract of land situate in Buckingham Town^{sh} in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a post a corner of ^{eroy} ~~Mary~~ Phillips Land thence by the same North West two hundred and seven perches to a post, thence by the reputed land of Peter Worrell, North East fifty eight perches to a post in the line of a street, thence by the same south East two hundred and seven perches to a post thence by land of Thomas Parsons South West fifty eight perches to the place of Beginning, Containing seventy one acres with the usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent - Surveyed June 11th 1734.
