



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in York Township in the County of York late part of the County of Lancaster survey'd the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April 1747 for Bernhart Lawman by Thomas Cookson Esq<sup>r</sup> late D.S. of Lancaster County, the Courses & Distances of which Survey did not close, & therefore it was resurvey'd the 11<sup>th</sup> day of December 1759 & found to contain one hundred & forty four Acres & the Allowance of six Acres & Cent for Roads & Highways.
