



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty Second day day of May 1733. There was Surveyed unto George Mifflin, Alexander Woodroop and Thomas Potts on the Eighteenth day of October 1733. a tract of Land Situate Near Coolbrookdale, in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a White Oak, a Corner of Derick Clever's Land, thence by the Same South thirty three degrees East one hundred and twenty five perches ~~and~~ by Land of William Attwood, the Same Course Ninety perches, and by Vacant Land Seventy five perches to Chestnut Oak, thence North forty degrees East, Sixty two perches by land Late of Evan Owen, 160 p^s by by Vacant Land deced, and Vacant Land, one hundred and twenty Eight perches to a Heap of Stones, thence by Vacant Land North forty Six degrees, West Nineteen perches and by land of Edward Farmer and Company, one hundred and twenty three perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land, South Sixty Seven degrees, West two hundred and fifty Six perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Three hundred and Sixty four Acres with the Usual Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.
