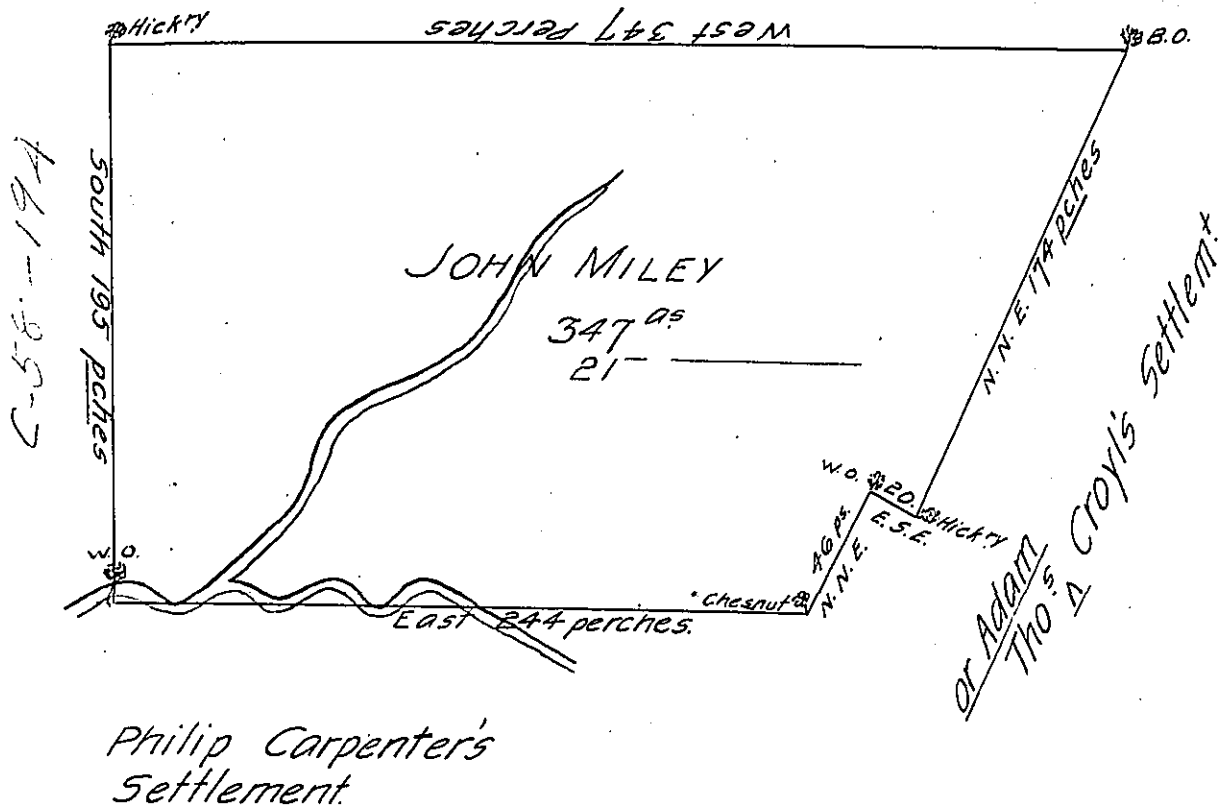

Philip Carpenters Settlement.

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the twelfth Day of October 1734 Surveyed unto John Miley A certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Lancaster, near the Head of Chestogoe Creek Beginning at a marked White Oak near a small Branch of the said Creek Thence extending East by Land Settled by Philip Carpenter, two hundred and forty four perches to a marked Chestnut Thence by Land settled by Thomas Croyl, North North East forty six perches, East South East twenty perches to a marked Hickory, and North North East One hundred and seventy four perches to a marked Black Oak Thence by vacant Land West three hundred and forty seven perches to a marked Hickory, and South One hundred and ninety five perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Three-forty seven Acres and the usual Allowance of six perches for Roads &c. Surveyed the 27th Day of October A.D. 1734.
