



By Order of the Proprietary. Surveyed on the 28th Day of March Anno Dom. 1738, to Elizabeth Moor a tract of Land Scituate in the Townships of Donegal & Hempfield, in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Black Oak in the line of John Speer's land North 48 degrees West 147 perches to a Black Oak North West by West 180 perches to a Hickery thence South 22 deg West 142 perches to a post, thence South 48 deg East 183 perches to a White Oak, thence down—Sickasalunga Creek, South 33 perches to a post, thence East by South 16¹/₂ perches to a post, thence North 10 deg East 92 perches to a post thence North 30 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Three¹/₂ Hundred & four Acres, and the Allowance of Six Acres ¹/₄ Cent for Roads & highways.
