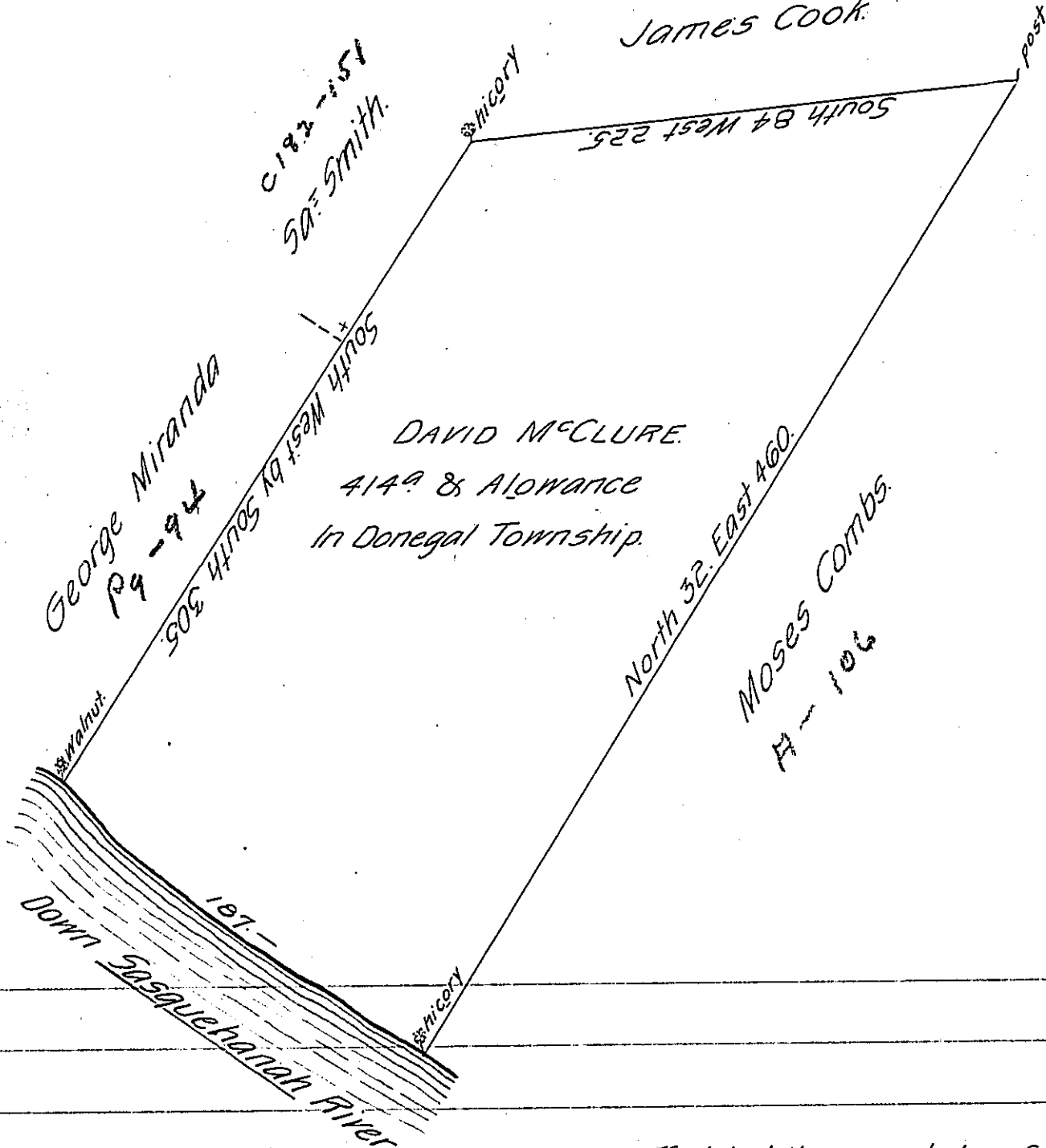

By Vertue of a Warrant from the Proprietors dated the second day of 7ber 1735
 By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed the twenty first day of April Anno Dom. 1736
 to David McClure a Tract of Land Scituate in the township of Donegal in the
 County of Lancaster Beginning at a hicory by the side of $\frac{3}{4}$ Sasquehanna Riv-
 er in the line of Moses Combs land, thence North 32 deg East 460 per-
 ches to a post, thence South 84 deg West 225 per: to a hicory, thence
 South West by South 305 perches to a Walnut standing by the side of
 the Af^s River, thence down the said River 187 perches to the place of Be-
 ginning. Containing four Hundred & fourteen Acres and the Allowance of
 Six Acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads & Highways. Surveyed
 Rate of Warr^t 16¹/₂ Cent at 6 Mo. $\frac{1}{2}$ Sa: Blunston--
 & 1/2 sterl^o Quit Rent $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent $\frac{1}{2}$ Annum.
