



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Bearing Date the 3rd Day of May Anno Dom: 1739, Surveyed to Robert McFarlan two Hundred Acres of Land with the further Addition Also of Eighty Six Acres in the Township of Donegal & County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post standing By the Side of Little Sickasalongo Creek in the Line of Andrew Mayes's Land, thence North 56 deg. West 282 per. to a hickery, thence North 15 deg. East 50 per. to a hickery, thence by Hugh Whites land North West by West 200 per to a hickery, thence South 60. deg. West 144 per to a white Oak, thence South 30 deg. West, 94 per. to a hickery, thence South 73 deg. East 282 per to a Water Beech By the 5th Creek, thence up the Several Courses of the 5th Creek 103 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing in the whole Two Hundred & Eighty Six Acres and the Usual Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads &c.
