



By Virtue of a Warrt from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the twenty fourth Day of ^{May} March Anno D. / 1738.

I have Survey'd and Laid Out unto Wm Mc Meen in the the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on On the West Side-Susquehanna river Three hundred acres of Land with allowance of Six % Cent.

Beginning at a Marked-tree Standing by Conedagwanett Creek Thence South Twenty four Degrees Westerly one hundred and four perches to a White Oak. Thence South One hundred and Eight pches to-White Oak. South Seventy Nine Degrees Easterly one hundred and Eight perches to-post. Thence South Thirty three Degrees Easterly One hundred perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence North fifty Six Degrees Easterly one hundred Thirty four pches To a White Oak Standing on the Line of Indian Mannor. Thence North Thirty four Degrees Westerly Two hundred & Twenty four perches to a beech by the Said-Creek, then up the Same Traversing the Several Courses thereof near about One hundred perches to the place of Beginning.
