



By Virtue of a Warrant Dated the 7th of June Anno Domini 1738. The Above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed to Elias Moyer in Erle Township And Lancaster County. Beginning at a White Oak Corner of Jacob Read thence South 30^d Degrees East by Said-Read 68 perches to a White Oak, thence South 20 Degrees West 62 perches to a White Oak. thence West by North by Vac^t Land 38 perches to a Black Oak. thence South West by West 48 perches to a White Oak, Cor. of Jacob Bowman's Land, thence West by North By 0° 44 perches to a White Oak. thence North 30 Degrees West by Christopher Solinger 236 perches to a White Oak. thence East by Jacob Brotherly 69 perches to a Hickery, thence South 30^d East by Abraham Terr. 144 per. to a post, thence N. 60^d East by 0° 98 perches to the Place of Beginning. &c. Containing One Hundred and Thirty Seven Acres Beside the Usual allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ cent for Roads.
