



No 1 situate between Jacks Mountain and Rocky Ridge in Huntingdon County and township of Huntingdon (now Brady) Surveyed on the 2nd day of September 1793 in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Kelly SUR dated the 22nd day of May 1793 then said to contain Fifty acres Eighty perches and allowance of six percent for roads &c.

No 2 situate between Jacks Mountain and Rocky Ridge in Huntingdon County and township of Huntingdon (now Brady) Surveyed on the first day of May 1794 in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Kelly SUR dated the third day of September 1793 then said to contain Ninety six acres Seven-nine perches and the allowance of six percent for roads &c.

Both resurveyed the third day of May 1837 in pursuance of an order dated 25th day of February 1831 granted to William Kelly and now contains together one hundred and fifty four acres and fifty eight perches and allowance of six percent for roads &c. Examined and found correct this 22d day of February 1848
