



A Draught of *Up Little Conestogo Creek & bounded therewith three hundred & three perches* in *Manner Township* a Tract of Land Situate in *Lancaster County (Part of the Honourable the Proprietaries Manor of Conestogo)* being part of a Larger Tract of four hundred acres formerly survey'd for Alexander and Samuel Richey Beginning at a marked white oak standing on the East Bank of Little Conestogo Creek thereof opposite to the Mouth of the N.W. branch thence by Land of David Herr junr (part of the said original Tract) S. 81° E. 127 perches to a marked white oak East 15 perches to a marked Spanish Oak by a Spring & N. 62° E. 16 1/2 perches to a marked white oak standg on the West Bank of Big Conestogo Creek thence down the same and bounded therewith two hundred and sixty five perches to a marked walnut thence by Land late of John & Abraham Miller S. 76° W. 106 perches to a marked white oak standing on the East bank of Little Conestogo Creek aforesaid thence up the same and bounded therewith three hundred & three perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred and twenty acres & the allowance of six acres P. Cent for Roads & Highways Surveyed the 13th 7 ber 1759 for Benjamin Miller
