The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed unto Caspar Mengal in the Township of Tulpehocken on the North Side of the Creek and Heidelberg on the South in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a White Oak at a Corner of of the Land of Leonard Caplinger Thence North 85 Degrees East by the Same 37 perches to a White Oak Thence South 50 Degrees East by the Same 94 perches to a Small Black Oak Thence North 40 Degrees East by the Same 40 perches to a Small Black Oak Thence South 50 Degrees East by Vacant Land 58 perches to a post by Tulpehocken Creek Thence up the Same on the Several Courses 130 perches to a stone on ye South Side thereof Thence South 85 Degrees West by Vacant Land 62 perches to a White Oak Thence North 30 Degrees West by ye Same 125 perches to a White Oak Thence North 17 Degrees East by Vacant Land 63 perches to a post on the Line of ye 5^d Caplinger Thence South 50 Degrees East along the Same 55 perches to ye place of Beginning Containing One Hundred acres Beside Six allowance
