



In Pursuance of a Warrant for 400 acres of Land Baring date the 17<sup>th</sup> of March 1813 Was surveyed on 21<sup>th</sup> day of April 1813 for Hugh Lackey the above discribed tract of Land Containing four Hundred and nineteen acres and five perches and allowance of six P<sup>r</sup> Cent for Roads, &c. Situate on the Med waters of Big sandy Creek in followfield township Crawford County and at the time of surveying the said Hugh Lackey was living on the same with his family and had a house barn &c, and had at least more than thirty acres of land Cleared fenced and in a good state of cultivation.
