The warrant in pursuance of which the above tract of land was survey'd and is now returned, was taken out for land which had before the date of this warrant been survey'd by Col. Armstrong to one Sherran, but the warrant was at the special desire of the said Henderson laid on the above land and tho' an intire removal of it, yet as I did not then apprehend any person would be injured by it, I complied with his request and have only to add that by making this survey, I filled every warrant which Henderson ever put into my hands, and that at a time when he Henderson had full Liberty to make his surveys where and how he pleased.
