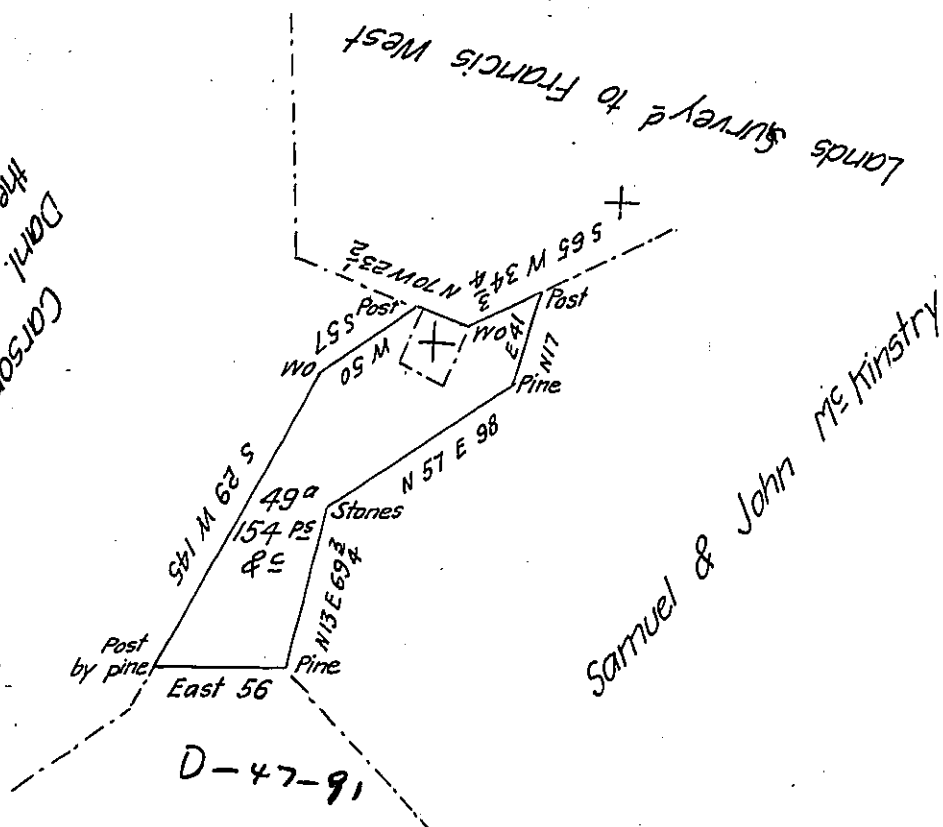

Draught a tract of land Containing forty nine acres and 154 perches and the allowance of six P. Cent for roads & S Situate in Fermanagh township Mifflin County Surveyed the 12<sup>th</sup> of Dec<sup>r</sup> 1803 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to James Henderson & James Brooks, dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of August 1793.
