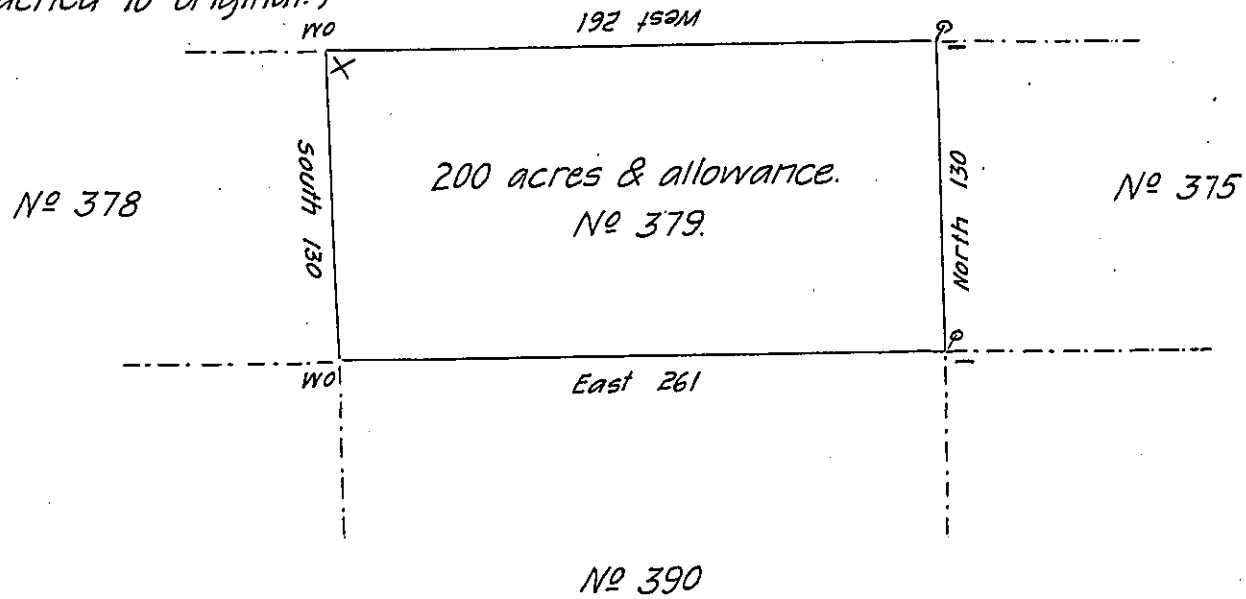

 Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 intituled an  
 Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation lands  
 promised the Troops by this Commonwealth, and by order of  
 the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Honorable  
 Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November  
 1785 the above described Tract of two hundred acres of land  
 and Allowance of Six P<sup>ct</sup> Cent ~~and~~ Roads &c

 River in Westmoreland County.
