



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Twelfth day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Adam Moser a Tract of Land Situate in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of Richard Gregory's land thence by Vacant Land North forty degrees East one hundred and seventy two perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant Land South fifty degrees East one hundred and forty Eight Perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South forty degrees West one hundred and Seventy five perches to a post thence by land of Richard Gregory North West forty three perches to a Chesnut Tree thence by the said Gregory North fifty degrees West one hundred and five perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty Acres with the usual allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent. Surveyed 9<sup>th</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> 1734
