



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Springtown Manor in the County of Chester now in the Possession of James M^cCroskry, Beginning at a post standing on Indian Creek and from thence extending by Andrew Wilsons Land South 61 perches to a marked black oak, thence by Land belonging to the Heirs of Francis Long South 14° West 230 perches to a Stone, thence by the Manor Line South 87 degrees and a half East 94 perches to a stone, thence by a small Piece of Ground laid out for a Burying Place North 50 1/2° East 50 perches to a Stone and South 58 Degrees East 46 perches to a stone in a line of the said Manor thence along the same North 87 Degrees and a half East 75 perches to a Stone, thence by Thomas Browns Land North 14 degrees West 192 perches to the said Indian Creek thence up the same on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred and forty seven Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent for Roads &c^o Surveyed the 6th day of October 1753 by Direction of the Honourable the Proprietaries
