



The above is a Draught of a Tract of Land, Situate on the Waters of Ten Mile Creek in Washington County Called Fanny's Green Containing 400 Acres of Land Surveyed January 19th 1785. In pursuance of a Certificate granted to George Myres of which the following is a Copy;

We the Commissioners for adjusting Claims to Unpatented Lands in the Counties of Monongahela, Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that George Myres is entitled to four hundred Acres of Land in the County of Monongahela on the Waters of Ten Mile Creek to include his Actual Settlement made in the Year One thousand seven hundred and Seventy one also a Right in Preemption to One thousand Acres adjoining thereto.

Given under our hands at Cox's fort the 18th Day of February 1780 in the fourth Year of the Common West
