



In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 3<sup>d</sup> June 1748 granted to John McMichael a survey was made by Edw<sup>d</sup> Scull (since deceas'd on the 12<sup>th</sup> September following of a Tract of One hundred acres of Land & allow<sup>e</sup> Situate at a place Call'd the Great Swamp on a branch of Jones's Creek then in Bucks now Northampton County) Call'd the Big Meadow Drawn in the Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> Office from James Scull's Certificate Taken from Edw<sup>d</sup> Scull's Field works November 22<sup>d</sup> 1783.
