



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietars bearing date the fourteenth day of October Anno 1738. I have Survey'd and laid out unto John Barrisford on the branches of Marsh Creek in the County of Lancaster on the West Side of Susquehanna river Two hundred acres of Land with allowance of Six P Cent Beginning at a Hickery a Corner of Joseph Dixons Thence South forty Degrees Westerly Two hundred and twelve perches to a white oak Thence North fifty Degrees Westerly one hundred and sixty pches and a half to a hickery Thence North forty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and twelve to a Spanish oak in the Line of the said Dixons Land Thence South fifty degrees Easterly one hundred and sixty perches and a half to the place of Beginning Survey'd June 5th 1739 P. Zach Butcher Dpt. To Benja Eastburn Surveyr Genl
