



In Pursuance of a Warrant of Resurvey to me directed bearing date the 11th day of December 1769 requiring me to Resurvey for Jonathan Mifflin the Water part of a Certain Bank and Water Lot Situate on and before the Bank in the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> Originally granted to Jonathan Duckett and afterward Resurveyed for William Bingham in the year 1760 which Water part is since become vested in said Mifflin. These may Certify that I did on the 13th day of August 1770 Resurvey the said Water part of said Lot and find it to be Situate between Sassafrass and Vine streets in the said City Described and bounded as follows viz Containing in Breadth on King Street (so Called) and the River Delaware thirty feet and extending in length from the East side of said King Street into the River Delaware to the extent of 250 feet from the East side of Delaware Front Street Bounded Westward by King Street aforesaid, Northward by Jonathan Mifflins other ground Eastward by the River Delaware at the extent aforesaid and Southward by a Ten feet Public Alley.
