



The above is a draught of a tract of land called Mount fearnot situate on the dividing ridge between the waters of Robinsons run and Ragoon creek in Robinson and Fayette townships, in Washington and Allegheny Counties Pa Containing seventeen acres and eighty five perches with the usual allowance. Executed February 20th 1816 in pursuance of a warrant granted Edward M^cCray for one hundred acres dated January 21st 1815. Mr. M^cCrays claim to a part of this survey is disputed by William M^cCandless, who claims the part included within the lines edged with yellow in Allegheny county. - M^cCandless' claim is founded on an actual resident settlement which ^{commenced} about six years ago. - Mr. M^cCrays claim is also founded on an actual resident settlement which commenced about eighteen years ago. Mr. Leet who executed the survey at my request on the warrant assured me that there were two distinct corners viz an Ash and ^{an} hickory at the points where the two opposite lines approximate so near each other. - Mr. M^cCandless also told Mr. Leet that he had a warrant for his claim but would not show it neither would he show a receipt for the money paid in ^{to} the land Office the truth of which Mr. Leet doubted.
