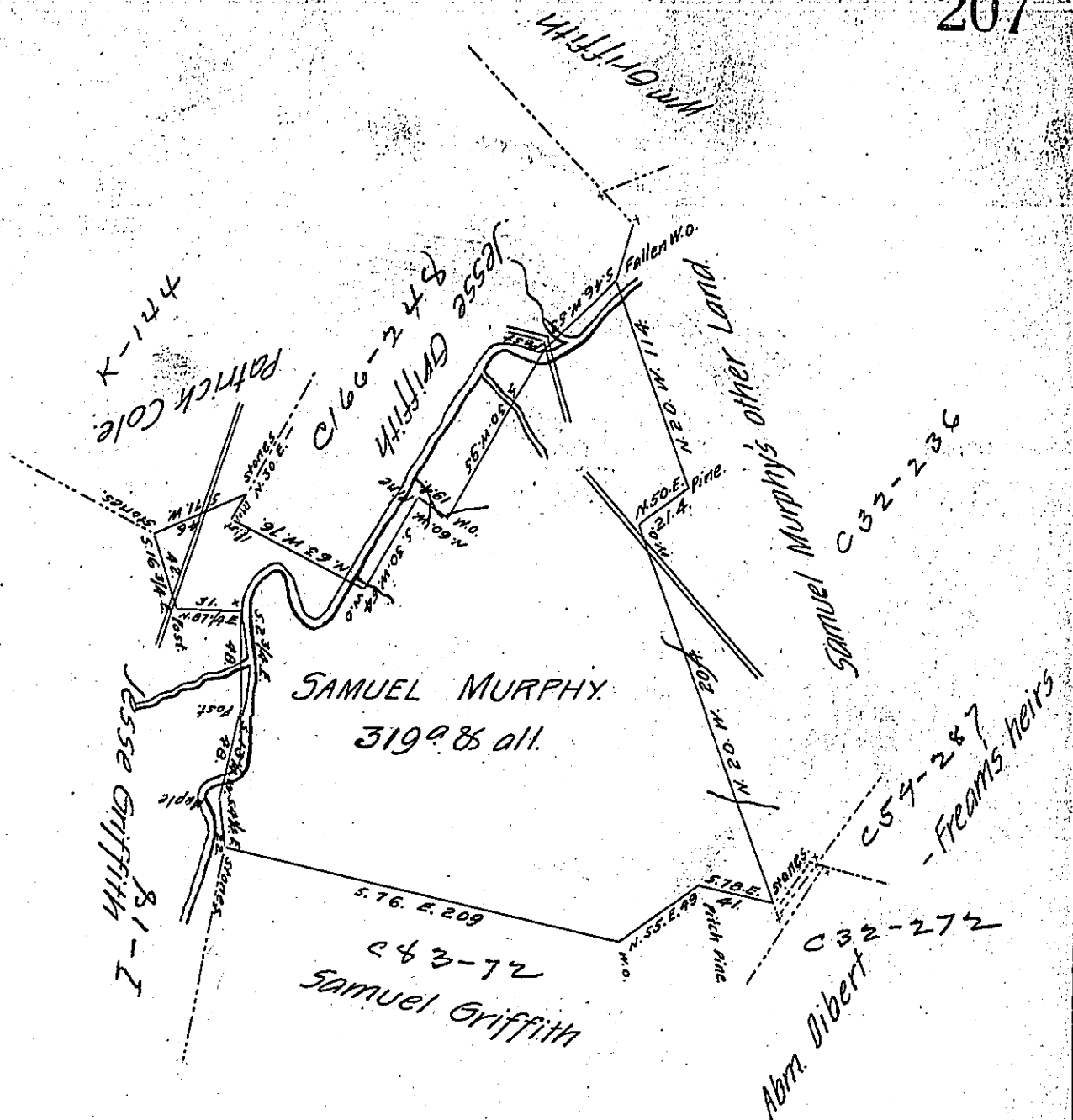


Jesse Griffith carents the acceptance of this return and claims that part of the survey on the north and west side of Quemahoning Creek, amounting to sixteen and a half acres.

Containing three hundred and nineteen acres and allowance and surveyed on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1843, in pursuance of a Warrant for 290 a. bearing date the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June 1843, granted to Samuel Murphy, Esq<sup>r</sup>.
