


FORM NO. 1.



By virtue of a Warrant dated the 16<sup>th</sup> Decemr. 1808. Surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1809,  
to Henry Miller, the above described tract of land situate in East Penn township,  
Northampton County, containing eighty-one Acres an-half & the allowance of six p. Cent  $\frac{1}{8}$

I am told the above land was formerly Surveyed for William Thomas, who sold it  
to Evan Loyd, -Loyd became deranged, Thomas was Attainted of Treason, Loyd's  
friends Obtained a decree before the Judges of the Supreme Court for the land  
that William Rex purchased Loyd's Right, but could get no title & sold to Henry Mil-  
ler. - Loyd still remains deranged & ineable to make a title.
