



The above described tract of Eighty eight acres, One hundred and twenty six perches of Land, and allowance, is part of a larger tract, situate in Letterkenny Township, Franklin County, which was surveyed to Robert, James and John M<sup>c</sup>Connell, in pursuance of their Warrant, granted to them for 300 acres; bearing date the ~~4<sup>th</sup>~~ 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1785; Surveyed and laid off for John & Joseph M<sup>c</sup>Connell, (sons of said Robt M<sup>c</sup>Connell) the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1801, by Daniel Henderson, Esq<sup>r</sup> late Deputy Surveyor, as appears by Official drafts, thereof, now remaining in my Office; Resurveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1806.
