



In pursuance of a warrant granted to Robert Morrison bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1813. Surveyed the above described tract of land containing one hundred and thirty one acres <sup>one hundred</sup> <sub>thirty six</sub> perches & one tenth of a perch and allowance proportioned at six per cent for roads &c including a dwelling house & about twelve acres land cleared & fenced together with other improvements apparently first commenced in the year 1798. Situate on the waters of Seweety Creek in Mountpleasant township in the county of Westmoreland.
