



Some time about the 9th and 10th of April AD 1830. Resurveyed the above described tract of land for the present owner Alexander Clark Esq^e containing two hundred and forty acres Sixty six perches and the allowance of six pr. Ct &c. by the same ^{bounded} by lands surveyed to John Davison. Robert Cooper and Joseph Dunlap &c. lands of the heirs of Joseph Clark. John S.C. Woodward and Matthew Franklin. the latter of which was formerly a part of the same. which was surveyed on the 23^d of Nov^r AD 1786 in pursuance of two Warrants one of which was granted to Christopher M^r Michael and the other to James Clark. the former dated March 28th AD 1786 and located upon the land represented by the above draught.
