 usual allowance six 1/2 Cent. for Roads & Survey  
 the 25th Cent. of same 1/10 for John Nagle in pursu-  
 ance of a warrant granted to him the 15th Decr 1764  
 in the County of Bedford  
 the 25th Cent. of same 1/10 for Thomas Smith 250±  
 in the County of Bedford
