Resurveyed the 16<sup>th</sup> day of December 1785 for John Carnahan on an order of survey to James Lindsay bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 1850 John Carnahan claims the piece included within the dotted lines Marked A containing about twelve acres & allow<sup>ce</sup> which had been included in William Martins survey made <sup>the 30<sup>th</sup> Aug<sup>t</sup> last</sup> on an order of survey to James Martin dated the 3<sup>d</sup> Ap<sup>l</sup> 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 2442 and requests that the above representation <sub>of his claim</sub> may be laid before the Honorable the Board of Property
