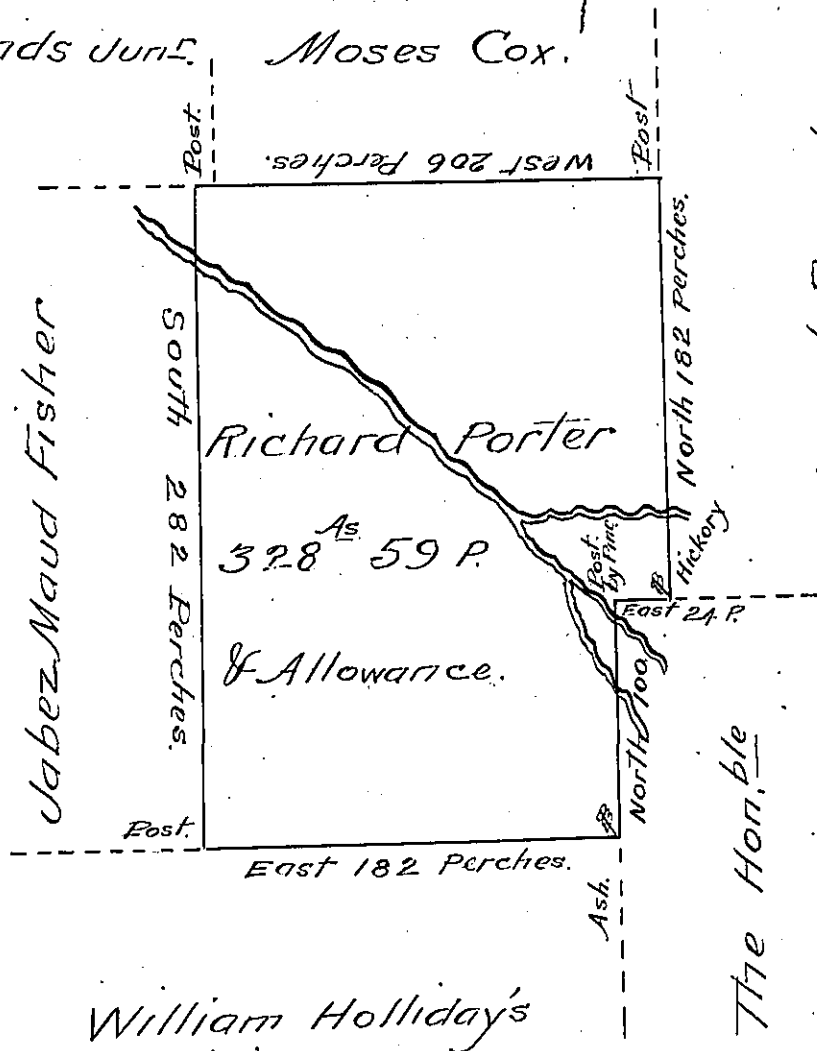

A DRAUGHT of a Tract of Land called the Chest Farm being part of a larger Tract of the same name situate on the Waters of Chest Creek on the Southeastwardly side of said Creek to the Southeast of a Tract of Land granted to Samuel Rhoads junior and adjoining it and adjoining Lands Surveyed for the Hon^{ble} the Proprietaries Joseph Russel Moses Cox and Jabez Maud Fisher and Land claimed by William Holliday about a Mile and an half above the first forks of said Creek and about four Miles above where the old Path from Franks Town to Kittanning crosses the said Creek in the County of Bedford Containing three hundred and twenty eight Acres and fifty nine Perches and the usual Allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads &c, Surveyed the 17th Day of June 1773 (obl) Richard Porter in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him Dated 27th Day of April in the year aforesaid by To John Lukens Esq^e Surveyor } Thomas Smith (obl) General of Pennsylvania &c.
