The land above described is the same as a survey Containing 113 <sup>05</sup> 137 per & all made on a warrant granted George Greer dated the 25<sup>th</sup> of November 1799 William Moore conveyed the above land to Shadrack Samuels by deed dated the 17<sup>th</sup> of June 1765 & recited the above Warr<sup>t</sup> as the title - Samuels conveyed the same to John Haw by deed dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of May 1772. - Hawe conveyed to John Robeson by deed dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of July 1772 - Robeson conveyed to John Steel. - Steel's heirs conveyed to George Greer.
