By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the tenth day of September 1734. Surveyed unto Daniel Pennington a tract of land. Situate in New Britain in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a corner Stone of Jeremiah Langhorne's land, thence by the same South east three hundred and thirty three perches to a post in a line of John Wells land thence by the same North east eleven perches to a post thence by land of George Fitzwater, North west forty six perches to a post thence by the 3^d Fitzwater's land, North east one hundred and twenty ^{two} perches to a post thence by land of Gephas Child, North west two hundred and thirty eight perches and by land late of Richard Hill decd forty eight perches to a Hickery thence by Vacant land, South west one hundred and thirty three perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing two hundred and twenty seven acres with the usual allowance of Six P. Cent.
