



Surveyed on the 22 day of Feb^r. 1733 to Francis Parvin a certain tract of land, Situate on the East side of the river Skunkill about Ten Miles Westward of Oley in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Black Oak standing on the East side of the River Skunkill thence by Vacant land North sixty Degrees East two hundred & seventy two ^{Perches} to a Post, thence by Vacant land North thirty Degrees West two hundred perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant land South sixty Degrees West two hundred & Eighty six perches to the S^d River thence down y^e Several Courses of y^e same to y^e place of beginning Containing three hundred & twenty five acres with usual allowance.
