



Pursuant to two Warrants dated the 10th or 11th day of June 1725 for 500⁰⁰ acres. Surveyed and laid out to William Passmore a certain tract of land situate on a branch of Per(o b l i t e r a t e d) of Philad^e(obliterated) at a Black Oak a Corner of the S^d Passmore's other(obl) thence by land of Samuel Powell^{South West} two hundred fifty three perches to a Post, thence by Vact land Land South East three hundred forty eight perches to a Post in the line of John Penns Manour thence by the same North forty degrees East two hundred fifty four perches to a Post being a Corner of the Said Passmore's land thence by the same North West three hundred twenty two perches to the place of beginning Con^t f(obl) acres wth usual allowance
