



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 18th of October Anno Dom 1737. The above described tract of land was Surveyed unto Rees Philip in Robinson township in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Stone a Corner of ye land of Moses Embre, thence North 63 degrees West by Vacant land 80 perches to a Chesnut Oak thence South 27 degrees West by ye same 46 perches to a White Oak, thence North 63 degrees West by ye same 40 perches to a small Black Oak thence South 27 deg^s West by the same 116 perches to a post, thence South 63 degrees East by ye same Vacant land 120 perches to a Post, thence North 27 degrees East by the land of Moses Embre 162 perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and four acres beside ye allowance of six P Cent for Roads and Highways.
