



By Virtue of a Warrt from the Hon^{ble} Proprietarys date the first day of Novemb^r anno Domⁱ 1735. There is Surveyd unto William Passmore two hundred acres of land with allowance of Six P. Cent in Lancaster County on the West Side Susquehannah River and Begins at a blak Oak on the Line of James Wilsons Land Thence South Seventy eight degrees east one hundred and twenty eight Pches to a Chestnut tree thence North east one hundred Pches to a Black Oak thence North twelve degrees easterly one hundred and fifteen Pches to a Gum tree thence North Seventy eight degrees Westerly one hundred and eighty two Pches to the Place of Beginning
