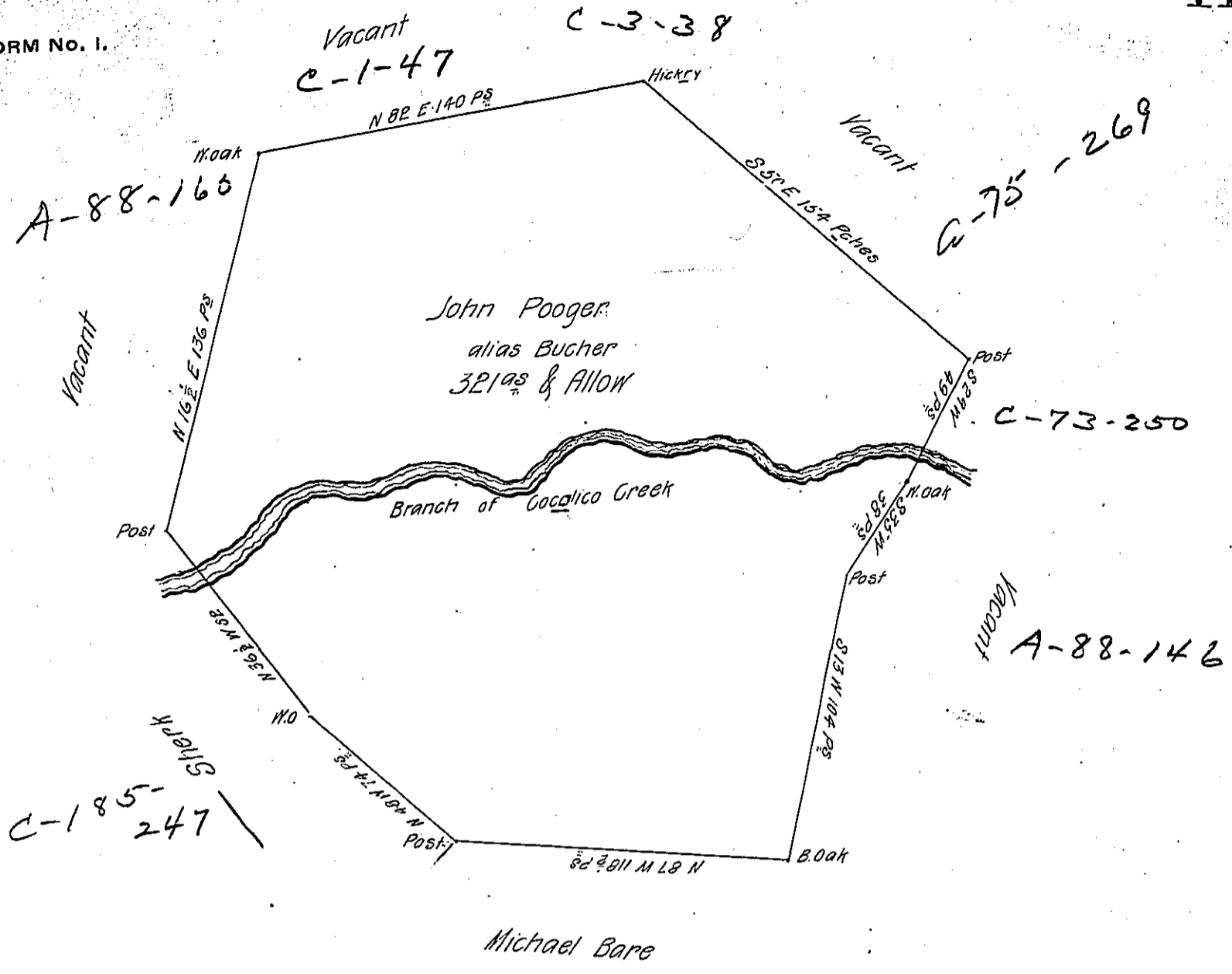

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 22nd day of January Anno Dom 1735 for Surveying unto John Pooger three hundred acres of land. There was Surveyed unto the S^d John Pooger a certain tract of land situate on a branch of Cocalico Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a marked Black Oak at a Corner of Michael Bares land thence extending by S^d Bares land North 87 deg^s West 118 1/2 Pches to a Post thence by Sherk's land North 48 deg^s West 74 Pches to a Marked White Oak & North 36 1/2 deg^s West 82 Pches to a Post thence by Vacant land the Six Courses and distances next following Viz: North 16 1/2 deg^s East 136 Pches to a marked White Oak North 82 deg^s East 140 Pches to a Marked Hickery South 50 deg^s east 154 Pches to a Post South 29 deg^s west 40 Pches to a White oak South 35 deg^s West 38 Pches to a Post and South 13 deg^s West 104 Pches to the Place of Beginning. Containing three hundred & twenty one acres & the usual allowance for Roads &c^o
