



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries dated the first day of November anno Domⁱ 1735. There is Surveyd unto William Passmore four hundred and twenty five acres of land with allowance of six P. Cent in Lancaster County on the West side of Susquehannah River and Begins at a White oak a Corner of John Healds land thence South Sixty nine degrees Westerly one hundred and sixty Pches to a White Oak thence North Seventeen degrees Westerly two hundred and twenty Pches to a White Oak thence North Sixty two degrees easterly Sixty ~~##~~ ^{eight} Pches to a White Oak thence North one hundred and eighty one Perches to a Maple Tree thence North Sixty two degrees easterly one hundred and thirty two Perches to a White Oak then South one hundred and eighty one Pches to a Black Oak thence South thirty two degrees easterly one hundred and ninty five Pches and an half to a White Oak on the line of the 3^d Healds land then by the 3^d land South forty degrees Westerly one hundred and seven Perches to the Place of Beginning
